



Nagpur: The quiet Mall Road in Karmaveer cornerment of colonial times is witnessing turbulence these days. The seven-km long road with its turns included remains a hidden gem as the city fast expands in its direction. Sprawling colonial era bungalows spread in 1.5 to over 4 acres of estates belonging to Colborne Park, the district. The area which is in proximity to Army establishments comes under the cantonment board at present. Now as the government is planning to do away with the cantonment boards, the bungalow owners are looking to throw away the Army yoke. In May this year, the Centre decided to dissolve the boards and turn the areas into military stations. The civilian areas are to be merged with the nearest municipalities. If the Mall Road is also included in the plan, then the residents get an opportunity to realize the value of their assets which is not possible at present due to strict defence rules governing the area. The residents have passionately built up a strong case, calling on state, national and international community to support their claim. They contend that the bungalows are an irreplaceable legacy & it is case to join the municipalities after the board is dissolved. For this, they are relying on the British law, denunciations of the country, to counter another rule of the times of Raj in which Army's claim rests.

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
